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

- Jose and 2hermano are signing on with NJB to paint murals at the school. Welcome!
- Concept Overview could include pollinators and producers, the web of life on a farm, natural wonders, etc.
- Cohesive design and efficiency is the primary focus. The goal is to create a level of panoramic continuity and a visual narrative throughout the school.

- The comprehensive budget overview comes in at \$85,000.
- If they started late Spring, some complications could include extra primer and conditioning for the walls, as well as the heat. Also, concurrent construction could create problems with dust.
- They will use 3 coats of clear-coat protectant that is anti-graffiti, anti-fade, and weatherproof. This is a district requirement, which is reflected in the cost.
- Prop 98 funds would be used for this expenditure. We have \$97,000 in the account.
